**Notes:** These figures are mostly based on the information provided in the G8 Hokkaido Toyako Framework for Action on Global Health -[Report of the G8 Health Experts Group Annex](#), the most recent reauthorization of [PEPFAR \(2009-2013\)](#) and information available on G8 websites. These are estimated projections based on public information currently available. G8 countries that did not explicitly commit HIV funds in 2010 in the Hokkaido document may intend to but have not published their commitment due to budget cycles or other domestic reasons. When a final accounting is completed additional official development assistance may be reported as having supported efforts to achieve universal access. Contributions to the Global Fund assume 55% will be directed towards HIV programmes based on previous trends. All currency conversions were conducted in November 2008 when daily fluctuations were significant and US\$ values may have changed by the time of publication. Glossary: NC = not yet committed; GF = The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria; HTM = HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria; HSS = Health Systems Strengthening; PEPFAR is the US President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief.
