Pre-Departure checklist

Your passport (valid for at least six months from your return date) and all travel documents
Valid visas for Germany and transit countries (where applicable)
Photocopies of your passport and visa(s) (for easy replacement if necessary)
Accommodation booking confirmation
Essential medication (and a note from your doctor for prescription medication)
Your mobile phone and headphones if you plan to access simultaneous interpretation during sessions (free Wi-Fi will be available)
Please familiarize yourself with the AIDS 2024 <u>code of conduct</u>

Transport

Transport from Munich International Airport to the conference venue



Public transport

Option 1:

- o Take the Lufthansa Express Bus to Munich Central Station. There are buses every 20 minutes.
- o Take the U2 line in the direction of Messestadt Ost.
- o Exit at the stop "Messestadt West" and walk to the conference venue.

Option 2:

- o Take the S1 line at "Flughafen München" in the direction of Leuchtenbergring. There is a train every 20 minutes. One adult single ticket costs EUR 16.
- o Change at Feldmoching and take the U2 in the direction of Messestadt Ost.
- o Exit at the stop "Messestadt West" and walk to the conference venue.

Public transport tickets:

Conference delegates are required to buy public transport tickets as follows:

- o Please buy a zone M-5 ticket if you are travelling from Munich International Airport to Messe München, the conference venue.
- o Please buy a zone M ticket if you are travelling from Munich city centre to Messe München, the conference venue.
- o A budget-savvy option is the Weekly IsarCard if you wish to have a valid ticket for a week.

Taxi:

- o Taxi ranks are in the departure and arrival areas of Terminal 1 and 2.
- o A ride to the conference venue costs approximately EUR 80.

Public transport stop near Messe München

Please note that the closest public transport stop is "Messestadt West". All conference delegates can access the venue via West Entrance only.

Getting around Munich



Registration requirements and arrival process

Monday, 22 July	06:30 - 18:00
Tuesday, 23 July – Thursday, 25 July	06:30 - 18:30
Friday, 26 July	08:00 - 15:00

We encourage you to finalize your registration in advance to avoid unnecessary queues at the registration desks.



Payment

If you have paid by bank transfer but have not received an invoice or registration confirmation, please bring a proof of payment or bank transfer slip with you to the conference.

Payments in person can be made by credit card. Cheques will not be accepted.

Arrival process

- o If your registration is confirmed, please have the QR code confirmation ready on your smartphone or as a printout from the email you received from the AIDS 2024 Registration team. Go to the badge self-printing desks located in the registration area and print your name badge.
- o If your registration is pending, please proceed to the registered delegates counters in the registration area to complete your registration.
- o For media, please go to the registered media counters in the registration area to complete your registration. Any missing media credentials must be provided and approved by the IAS Media team before your media registration is completed.

 Please note that we cannot guarantee approval of pending media registrations on site.

Delegates registered as part of a group

If you are registered as part of a group, please check with your group manager about when and where you will receive your name badge.

Please note:

To pick up your conference name badge or finalize your registration, you need to go to the registration area, which can be accessed only via the Messe München, West Entrance.



The virtual platform

How to log in to the AIDS 2024 virtual platform

The conference platform will be accessible through the AIDS 2024 <u>website</u>. To access the conference platform, you need a conference account, which is linked to the email address you used to register for AIDS 2024.

We recommend that you check your <u>conference account</u> now to ensure that your registration status is shown as "registration confirmed". Without this confirmation, you will not be able to access the AIDS 2024 platform. You are also encouraged to access and make yourself familiar with the conference platform before the official start of AIDS 2024.

Banks and currency

Exchange offices can be found in Munich Airport and throughout central Munich, particularly in the more tourist-oriented districts. Banks are a safe option but may have higher fees.

Most places in Munich accept credit cards. However, make sure that you check with your bank before arrival in Germany to be aware of any extra fees that you may be charged for using ATMs and credit cards.

Cloakroom

Only modest-sized handbags and laptop bags are allowed within the venue; anything larger must be placed in the cloakroom (which can be accessed via the Messe München, West Entrance only). All bags are subject to being searched. This measure will significantly enhance public safety and make it easier for all guests to gain access to the conference. We therefore advise you to leave your luggage at your hotel and limit the number and size of bags you bring with you to the venue as much as possible. If required, AIDS 2024 attendees can store luggage (for free) in the cloakroom (subject to availability and operating on a first-come, first-served basis due to space restrictions).

Security and safety

Munich is generally a safe city. However, to enjoy your time in the city to the fullest, you are advised to remain alert to petty crime, especially in crowded areas, public transport and the busy city centre.

Please note that smoking and use of e-cigarettes, e-cigars and vape pens within the conference venue, including the atrium are not permitted.

Museums and theatres

Bayerische Staatsoper

Richard Wagner's Parsifal on 23 July at 17:00

In his final music drama, Richard Wagner explores wounds that burn within individual people and within communities and responds with miraculous means that can alleviate suffering. The composer created a new myth with motifs from various legends, Christian and Buddhist religions, and Schopenhauer's world of ideas. Artist Georg Baselitz designed the powerful yet simple stage set in Pierre Audi's production.

Gärtnerplatztheater

A limited number of tickets are available for AIDS 2024 participants for the popular musical, CHITTY CHITTY BANG BANG, at the Gärtnerplatztheater in Munich.

About the play:

Inventor Caractacus Potts lives with his two children and eccentric father. The children have lost their hearts to an old racing car from the scrapyard, which is why their father has no choice but to buy it and restore it to its former glory. What's more, he turns it into a miracle car that can even swim and fly and whose strange engine noises immediately earn it the name, "Tschitti Tschitti Bäng Bäng".

However, the car's magical powers arouse the envy of Baron Bomburst of Vulgaria, who wants it at all costs. When he doesn't succeed, he has Caractacus' father, who he believes to be the inventor, kidnapped. Naturally, Caractacus and the children, together with Truly Scrumptious, daughter of a rich confectionery manufacturer, immediately set off for Vulgaria to free their grandfather with Tschitti's help! Buchheim Museum at Lake Starnberg

A limited number of reduced-price online tickets, reserved for participants of AIDS 2024, can be booked at this link.

About the museum:

The Buchheim Museum, situated at Lake Starnberg in Bernried, is primarily known for its Expressionist collection. But Lothar-Günther Buchheim's Museum of the Imagination unites four collections under one roof. At the centre of the Buchheim Museum is the Expressionist collection with paintings, drawings and prints by the Expressionist "Brücke" painters, Ernst Ludwig Kirchner, Erich Heckel, Karl Schmidt-Rottluff, Max Pechstein and Otto Müller.

The Buchheim Museum exhibits folk and ethnological collections with handicrafts from all over the world, Bavarian folk art and African cult objects. It also exhibits works by Lothar-Günther Buchhheim himself. The special attraction of the architecturally valuable museum is a footbridge suspended 12 meters above Lake Starnberg. On a clear day, the view extends from Starnberg to the Alps. Another special feature is a museum ship, unique in Bavaria; it takes visitors from Starnberg to Bernried by water.

Museum Brandhorst

- ANDY WARHOL & KEITH HARING: PARTY OF LIFE EXHIBITION

This is the world's first comprehensive institutional exhibition dedicated to both artists, exploring not only their vibrant art, but also their engagement with the AIDS epidemic and themes of mortality. This exhibition is a wonderful addition to the programme for AIDS 2024 delegates, offering them the opportunity to explore the Kunstareal district and its urban surroundings in Munich.

In conjunction with the exhibition, a limited-edition charity T-shirt featuring Keith Haring's 1989 artwork, "Ignorance = Fear Silence = Death", is available. Created at the height of the AIDS crisis in New York, this piece underscores Haring's activism, a central theme in his work. Proceeds from the sale of this T-shirt, priced at €65, will be donated to Münchner AIDS-Hilfe e. V. The T-shirt is available in our museum shop.
