1. About the IAS

2. About the IAS Community-Led Monitoring (CLM) programme

The IAS CLM programme aims to support greater understanding and adoption of CLM as an effective intervention to improve the quality and effectiveness of health programmes, including HIV. 3. Purpose

The IAS is seeking proposals from CLM implementing organizations to present findings and best practices from CLM programmes at relevant HIV and non-HIV regional, national, or international conferences, technical working groups, and/or strategy meetings. The audiences for these findings are stakeholders in the HIV response, policy makers, and funders, as well as public health stakeholders in non-HIV/TB/malaria fields, such as primary healthcare, sexual and reproductive health and rights, and pandemic preparedness.



4. Deliverables

Grants to support registration and travel costs will be awarded to local partners to present CLM work at relevant HIV or non-HIV related conferences, technical working groups or strategy meetings in 2024.

The following costs are eligible for support:

- Time/human resource capacity for team members to develop presentations, posters, or other materials
- Registration fees
- Travel costs, including transit, accommodation, and per diem

5. Proposal requirements

- Organization profile, including indication if the organization is led by communities or civil society in at least one of the following regions: Asia and the Pacific, anglophone Africa, francophone Africa, and Latin America and the Caribbean (max 1,000 words);
- A detailed description the conference(s), technical working group(s), or strategy meetings(s) of interest (must be held in 2024) and rationale for attending, including participant roles and expected outcomes (max 1,000 words);
- A detailed description of the presentation or materials to be developed and target audience (max 1,000 words);
- A budget and budget narrative outlining rationale and anticipated costs per activity (in USD);
- Two examples of previous CLM work;
- Proof of organization registration;
- Organization financial reports from the past two years.

6. Eligibility

- Organization requirements:
 - We strongly encourage applications from organizations conducting CLM based in the following regions: Asia and the Pacific, anglophone Africa, francophone Africa, and Latin America and the Caribbean.
- To be eligible for support, CLM implementing organizations must have a formal role in the event. This includes speaking roles, chairing roles, oral presentations, and/or poster presentations.

7. Submission details

Proposals must be sent by email to clm@iasociety.org with the subject, "RfP – Disseminating CLM findings and best practices", by 7 June, 23:00 CET.

This request for proposals (RfP) aligns with our broader efforts to support greater understanding and adoption of CLM as an effective intervention to improve the quality and effectiveness of



health programmes within and beyond HIV. It complements a concurrent RfP focused on analysis of CLM programme findings. Interested and qualified parties are welcome to submit proposals to one or both RfPs.
